PLEASE NOTE:

Due to the increase numbers of the Corona virus reported and the number of people waiting on tests results for themselves or for others they have been in contact with we are closing the building and live-streaming the Sunday service. The order of service will be 10:30-10:50 am worship, 11:00 am Sermon. We will keep you informed as to any decisions made regarding upcoming Sundays.

LHCF has begun holding a Sunday service at the building. See the protocols listed on the next pages. During the live-stream a message will pop up for you to click on to view. After the live-stream, the service will be uploaded to our home page on our website www.lhcfwarren.com After Sunday click on “Sermons” to view the video.** Here will be the order of service:

- Sunday service begins at 11:00 am with opening prayer, worship, communion, message, and closing prayer.

SUNDAY SERVICE REOPENING PROTOCOL

LIVE-STREAM

We will continue to live-stream services at fb.com/lhcfwarren and lhcfwarren.com, so we recommend that those with health issues or those who are unable to wear a mask for the entire service remain home and enjoy the gathering from there.

OUTDOOR SERVICE

The outdoor service, which will be the main service, will be set up in the small parking lot and surrounding area. Please bring your own chairs or a blanket, as well as water. Masks are required for all adults and children over 10 at the outdoor service. The masks are optional for younger children, but all children must remain seated with their family. Please bring your own mask and plan to wear it for the entire service. We will have masks available if needed. Everyone will also be expected to observe social distancing. Please check lhcfwarren.com or fb.com/lhcfwarren by 8 am on Sunday mornings for any changes to the outdoor service. If it rains the outdoor service will be canceled. The indoor service will be the only service in the event of rain and all indoor protocols must be followed.

INDOOR SERVICE

The outdoor service will be streamed on the screen in the sanctuary. The indoor service will be the only service in case of rain and all indoor protocols must be followed. There will be one entrance and exit to the building, which will be the Schoenherr entrance. This door will be locked and people will have to knock to get in. There will be hand sanitizer dispensers available for use. Masks are mandatory for everyone, including children inside the building. Children should remain seated with their families, and people are expected to observe social distancing. Please bring your own mask and plan to wear it the entire time you are in the building. We will have masks available if needed.

Building seating requires some separation for health purposes. Older members will be in one section, families with children will be in another section, and everyone else will be in a third section.

INDOORS & OUTDOORS

Please have one adult from each family pick up Communion elements for your entire family when you arrive. There will be a table with the elements inside the sanctuary entrance as well as at the outdoor service. Bathrooms are available for emergencies only; see bathroom protocols below. The drinking fountain is not available, so please bring your own water.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

We will need volunteers to assist in carrying this out. Please contact the church to help with the following:

- Setup: arrive early to help set up for the indoor service (arrive @ 10:30 am) and outdoor service (arrive @ 9:30 am)
- Greeters/Security Team: arrive at 10:45 am to direct parking if necessary and monitor church entrance and bathrooms to keep people safe
- Cleaning Team: remain after service ends for about 15 minutes to help wipe down and disinfect surfaces in the building
- Breakdown Team: remain after service ends for about 20 minutes to help break down and put away outdoor equipment

BATHROOM USE PROTOCOL

(Please limit bathroom use to emergencies only.)

1. bathroom use will be limited to one person at a time other than parents accompanying children (parent or guardian must accompany children to the bathroom)
2. use hand sanitizer
3. use bathroom
4. wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
5. dry hands
6. put gloves on
7. wipe down toilet handle and seat with disinfectant wipe (DO NOT DISCARD WIPE INTO THE TOILET)
8. discard gloves and disinfectant wipe into the trash bin (PLEASE DO NOT DISCARD THESE ITEMS INTO THE TOILET)
9. Exit

KENYA MISSION RESCUE

Our church supports a group of young girls from the Maasai tribe in Kenya. The laws in Kenya make female circumcision illegal, but the Maasai tribe continues to practice this and to marry girls off as young as 8 years old. Cost is approximately \$35 per month with approximately \$15 per month for books, school supplies, hygiene products, and uniforms that need to be replaced every other year. In November when the schools let out, we help pay for a safe house for the girls to stay in until school resumes in January. DIVINE SCHOOL FORT PORTAL, UGANDA

FOR IMMEDIATE PRESS RELEASE Alliance of Warren Evangelicals Denounce Racism and Injustice

June 3, 2020

Warren, MI — As members of the church in the city of Warren, MI, we deplore the actions that have occurred in our nation with the senseless death and precious loss of life of George Floyd at the hands of the Minneapolis police officer. We recognize that the abuse of police authority in this situation represents not an isolated incident, but a pattern of injustice in which Blacks and other people of color have been unjustly treated by the very arm of society that is meant to protect, serve, and nurture peace for all members of our society. We stand with all the people of this nation and ask for transformation of societal practices to reverse the course of history in this nation. We ask our leaders in government, in the judicial system, in the legal system to begin to address these matters, which are not new issues, but have represented the practices at work in this nation for over 400 years.

Psalm 89:14 reads, “Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you.” We cry out to God for His grace and blessing to pour these out upon our city and nation in this most fateful hour. We ask for a vision to remove ourselves from national immoralities, and not to sanction national complacency. We ask for healing for the trauma perpetrated upon the Black members of our society and ask that you would transform the ways in which we, as citizens, have sanctioned or tolerated abuses against humanity.

We stand with the right of those so harmed by racism in all its forms to gather to peacefully protest and to lift their voices in calling this nation to return to justice. While we do not approve of violent and destructive behavior from some of the protesters, we do not wish in doing so to summarily fail to recognize our own complicity in the injustice perpetrated through years and centuries upon Blacks and other peoples of color. We must recognize, confess, and turn from all injustice and begin to create a national and social climate the provides equal access for all peoples to peace and the blessings of God for which we all strive.

Finally, we join together in the church of Jesus Christ with all our brothers and sisters in this nation, and we pray that the Lord would look down upon us in this time of trouble and pour out His compassion and mercy on us so that the changes necessary, changes unprecedented in our American history, will be granted to us.
